14th Sunday MASS 7/ Creed 11; Sunday P.99 Eucharistic Prayer 3 (p27)



We live in times when we need to be really concentrating our prayers on the cause of Peace. The amount of terrible violence, hatred and general suffering that is being pumped into us by the media should not cause us to become nonchalant and not bothered. Likewise it should not encourage us to use violence ourselves, but it should enthuse us to work for and pray for peace even more. I cannot fully understand how people could do such atrocities to each other, in many cases in name of religion, and then also threaten the well being of others. We must also be careful not to tar everyone with the same brush and jump to conclusions and false judgments, as that is not the

way of peacemakers. The gentleness of Jesus needs to shine out of us, so that it becomes an overwhelming power for peace and reconciliation. Never give up on peace; never give up on being a good neighbour; always be willing to celebrate difference as a sign of the many gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Pope St John XXIII wrote this prayer which I share with you today:

Lord Jesus Christ,

Who are called the Prince of Peace,

Who are yourself our peace and reconciliation,

Who so often said,

"Peace to you,"

Grant us peace.

Make all men and women witnesses of truth,

Justice, and brotherly love.

Banish from their hearts whatever might endanger peace.

Enlighten our rulers that they may guarantee

And defend the great gift of peace.

May all peoples of the earth become as brothers and sister.

May longed-for peace blossom forth

And reign always over us all. Amen
