DON'T JUDGE EACH DAY BY THE HARVEST YOU REAP; BUT BY THE SEEDS THAT YOU PLANT The Sower going out to sow the seed is at the heart of the Gospel today. Today's society seems to judge its success or failure solely on achievement: it pays little attention to those who are gifted in preparing the round for others. Soon our young people will be tensed up waiting for exam results, some will not do as well as others; perhaps they may be late

developers, perhaps it is in more grown up circumstances that they will achieve. In all cases someone perhaps a parent or family member or a teacher or even a stranger may have planted a seed that they will not see grow but will flourish because of their efforts. Our faith story is like that, we try to pass on the seed of faith, but we know we must put our efforts into the hands of God that he will whisper into the ears of the next generation and bring the seed planted to fruition in his time.

Over the past years we have been helped in our evangelical calling as a Parish, by some very good teachers in our School none more so than Mr. Gallagher and Miss Teehan. They have planted the seed of faith in the hearts of many children, they have always worked to bring out the best of our children and to allow them to discover their true potential.
