



In a world where this week we have seen two innocent soldiers killed in Canada, where hostages are paraded on television and some later subjected to beheading. Where the viciousness of some toward people of their own nation and religion is so horrendous as to be the stuff of nightmares: where whole hosts of people are kidnapped in Nigeria by fanatics, you can see we still have a lot of work to do to get to the point where we can say, "We love one another as the Lord has loved us!" Yet we should not get downhearted or allow ourselves to be overcome with anger, nor should we take it out on the innocent, but perhaps it's

a time to reflect on where you and I fit into the picture. The victory comes with small victories that make a difference. Five volunteers sat in our hall on Friday waiting to help strangers who come to our Foodbank; some of our primary children desperate to get home because they were the main carer for a parent; members of the Legion of Mary visiting the sick and housebound to pray with them. Recently many young people came out of the woodwork and accompanied a family who had suffered a terrible tragedy. A young boy held his nerve when he discovered his home being burgled and enabled the police to catch the perpetrators. A Tesco First Aider used to small injuries in store found herself caring for a family badly injured in a crash. I recently spent some time with a brother and sister who kept vigil with their dying mother, and witnessed the wonderful care that goes on day and night in our hospitals. A family who every evening take their elderly neighbour a meal and at no cost. I could go on and on, but what I am trying to share with you, never underestimate the quality of love that can be shared in the smallest of ways. Evil only has its day when good people forget how to be good and forget that goodness is a natural gift in each one of a goodness that enables us to love one another just as the Lord has loved us! Never give up on yourselves and don't be surprised by what the Lord can do through you. Last few days of October, try a decade of the Rosary if you can. God Bless mik


