

I suppose we all need to encourage each other, to turn over new leaves in our lives; it is very easy to get stuck in a rut about many things. It's possible that when we reflect we discover that we take so much for granted, our family members, what is provided for us, that loved ones will always be there, that the bus will come, that water will always come out of the tap, and so on. Advent is a time, when we can step out of the usual, and begin to revalue who we are, what makes us who we are, and what influences we have in our lives. We are challenged by the Church to rejoice at the coming of the Lord at Christmas and asked to make provision so that as we now humbly say again in Mass" I am not worthy to receive you under my roof". Understand that the Lord is delighted to stay with you, love you, rest awhile with you; he is desperate to share his love with you and is only too willing to forgive you. Don't take him for granted! Don't take everything connected to your life for granted, use Advent and Christmas to affirm and enjoy everything as though it was the very first time of experiencing it. Kind words and actions can make others feel special; reaching out to forgive others, especially family members can bring a little more sparkle in your life. Searching out the Lord in the Sacrament of Reconciliation can fill us with the Christmas Star burst, which can lead us to the crib and encourages us to invite others to be there with us. Think on!
