STAY WITH US LORD ON OUR JOURNEY August: Month of the Immaculate Heart of Mary

"You are Peter, and I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven."



There is a very simple theme to this Sunday's readings: it is the principle of authority in the community of the Church: we are introduced to the idea that God gives authority to someone in the first reading, where Shebna is dismissed by God and replaced. This is a prelude to the Gospel story of Peter being given authority: not because he is powerful or wise in the world's sense, but because he was able to profess his faith in the one sent by the Father. This is the principle of all authority in the Church: it is to spring only from God and our faith in God,

professed by our way of life and rooted only in Christ, for ' to him all authority, in heaven and on earth, has been given.'

This week as a Diocese we pray for the parishioners of St. Joseph and St. Edward's parish, Longsight and Rusholme, with Fr. Rob Morland, SMA, and Fr Armand Maku, SMA. We pray for the parish primary schools and for Xaverian Sixth Form College, together with the Little Sisters of the Poor, the SMA Fathers and the priests of Opus Dei. May all be welcome in the Church of God

Saints of the week; 31 August; Saint Aidan and All Saints of Lindisfarne: born in Ireland, Aidan died at Bamburgh (Northumberland) in 651. A monk of Iona, he was sent to Northumbria when King Oswald asked for help in converting his kingdom, and established his monastery on the island of Lindisfarne. With him are remembered all those holy abbots and bishops, teachers and missionaries who made Lindisfarne a cradle of English Christianity.

St Monica's (today's feast) last recorded words as she lay in her bed in Ostia were: 'It does not matter where you bury my body. All I ask of you, is that wherever you may be, you should remember me at the altar of the Lord. '
