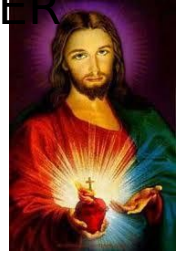

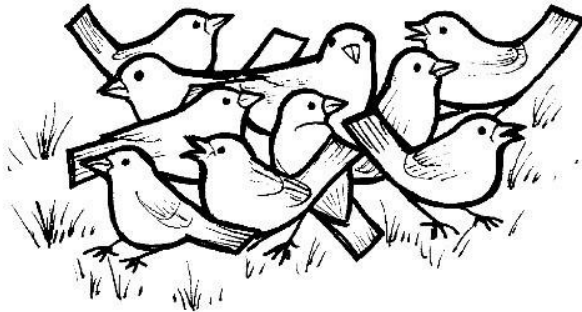

June month of the Sacred Heart

Do not be afraid of those who kill the body



Today's Gospel turns our thoughts to the strange phenomenon of persecution: throughout the history of mankind, the truth has been a commodity that often leads to persecution: the prophets of the Old Testament were attacked because of their message, as was the Lord Jesus himself. For his followers, the same may be true.

The point of the readings is not simply to face up to the reality of the opposition the Gospel may meet, but to remember where the truth of the Gospel comes from: the Father in heaven, who knows us and values us. So we can be confirmed in our mission to witness to the truth, not fearing those who merely kill the body.

Let us pray this week for the people of the parish of St. Catherine, Didsbury, for Fr. John Hitchen, their parish priest, and for Fr. Michael Deas. We pray for the parish primary school, the Barlow High School, the priests of Opus Dei, for the Franciscan Missionaries of St. Joseph and for Francis House

Pope Francis Tweet: "The Lord always watches over us with mercy. Let us not be afraid of approaching him! He has a merciful heart! If we show him our inner wounds, our inner sins, he will always forgive us. It is pure mercy! Let us go to Jesus!"
