be wipes so that after Confession you can clean the door handles, for the next person to enter. It may be that a number of people may be waiting, so please keep that in mind as you come to receive the Sacrament. Beforehand remember to keep to our social distance guidelines and spend time examining your conscience, and be as crisp as possible when sharing in the confessional, as others who have missed the Sacrament like you will be waiting.
