January: Month of the Holy name of Jesus

In the East, this Season of Christmas is called the 'Time of Manifestation', or Showing. Today is the 'Feast of the Manifestation', or the Showing of the Saviour to the whole world, to all nations. In the wise men who travel from the East, we see all the nations other than the people of Israel being welcomed at the New Temple of the New Covenant - the new born child in the manger. A look at the Psalm response shows this: "All nations shall fall prostrate before you, O Lord." The same is true of the key word in the second reading: "Revelation". Remember that for the people of Israel this was to be

their Messiah, come to restore their fortunes. By this feast, we proclaim God's plan was to extend his salvation to men and women of every nation, of every time and every place including us. In many ways this is our Christmas Feast, when we celebrate the Good News of the Saviour's birth revealed at last to us.

As the New Year begins, let us pray for the people of the parish of St. Marie and St. Joseph, Bury, and for Fr. Bill Foley, their parish priest. We pray for their primary schools, for St. Gabriel's High School and for Holy Cross College, as well as the patients, staff and chaplaincy at Fairfield General Hospital and the Bury Hospice. May Mary and Joseph lead us to Jesus the Lord.

$$20 + C + M + B + 21$$

The first two and last two digits represent the new year: 2021.  $\cdot$  The letter C, M and B stand for the Latin phase: Christus Mansionem Benedicat, which means: MAY CHRIST BLESS THIS HOUSE.  $\cdot$ 

It also helps you remember the names of the three Wise Men: Caspar (also known as Gaspar or Jaspar), Melchior and Balthasar. Chalking the door of your house is a sign of hospitality and of welcoming God into your home and is a great way to start the New Year!

The family could say together this prayer: Let us pray: Bless, O Lord God almighty, this home, that in it there may be health, purity, the strength of victory, humility, goodness and mercy, the fulfilment of your law, the thanksgiving to God the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. And may this blessing remain upon this home and upon all who live here. Through Christ our Lord. Amen
