Last week it was sheep: this week, the vine. Jesus offers us another (agricultural) image to explain the mystery of his offering of himself, and our belonging to him, our being part of him, which comes about through the sacrament of Baptism. This is, as was stated earlier, the period of Mystagogy, when the newly baptised are helped to see what life in Jesus Christ really means. Today this comes out strongly for all of us, with two of the three readings emphasising the moral aspects of life in Christ: it is not simply

enough to "belong" to him: our belonging must be shown by the works we do, by the fruits we bear - while remembering of course that we cannot bear fruit except in him.

Prayer with the National Eucharistic Congress in mind:

Dear Jesus, as I receive you today in Holy Communion, I pray for everyone in my family, my parish, and across our diocese. May they, and I, grow steadily in our love of you, and in our understanding of your wonderful gift of yourself to us in the Eucharist. Amen
