

At the beginning of the month I had my midyear check up with the Consultant, he was very pleased that his work had been a great success however he told me that the lesions on my lungs which had been noted at the time of the initial operation had begun to grow a little even though there were no obvious external symptoms. So a new adventure begins; I have a consultation at Christies on 8<sup>th</sup> July to determine what treatment is needed but am very hopeful that having been spotted at an early stage the cancer can be contained.
