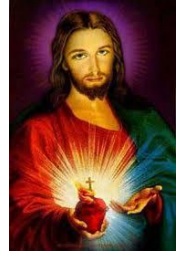

June month of the Sacred Heart

"You are Peter, and I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven."



Peter and Paul are the two great heroes of the Apostolic Age - Peter for leading the first Christian communities and binding them in unity, a role that springs from his profession of faith in Caesarea Philippi, and Paul for travelling throughout the Roman Empire as the Apostle to the Gentiles, ensuring that the Gospel could be heard by all. They both ended up in Rome, the heart of the Empire, where they crowned their lives of witness by shedding their blood for Christ. OPENING THE CHURCH FOR HOLY MASS NEXT SUNDAY 5TH JULY

We will not be able to open on Sunday's or on weekdays unless we have stewards to help and volunteers to help clean, so for example we will need to clean the Church after the 10am Mass to ready it for 6pm Mass, then likewise after for morning Mass on Monday etc. If we cannot do this then we will have to cancel certain days.

Please be patient, as there is a procedure to be followed and a system in place which has allowed us to open in the first place. Be Kind to the Stewards, as you may not be able to sit in your usual place for the foreseeable future. For weekdays, to allow us to cut down on cleaning, only part of the Church will be in use.

Next Sunday it will help if you would come in good time, and please note when our reduced capacity is reached, the Stewards will not be able to admit anyone else. **Masks must be worn.** Entrance through the main doors, please follow the one way system. Follow the Stewards instructions for Holy Communion which will only be given at the front of the Church. Newsletters will be available at the end of Mass and if we are able to provide Mass sheets, they can be taken home, those left will be destroyed and new ones provided for the 6pm Mass.

If you don't feel confident or have an underlying medical condition please do not feel you have to, or must come next weekend, begin when you feel ready. We will continue to broadcast Mass as we have been doing on Sunday and through the week.
