3rd Sunday of Lent March: Month of St Joseph



This week, in our journey through the Old Testament, we reach Covenant Number Three: and this is the big one - the Covenant with Moses at Sinai. The Ten Commandments are (or should be) familiar to us all: they form our side of the agreement with God - if we stick to these rules and commands, then we are truly God's people, and he is truly our God. If we ignore them, or break them, then we break the Covenant or relationship. The Temple was, for the people of Israel, the place that guaranteed the permanence of this Covenant - God dwelling with man.

Jesus alerts us to the new Temple - himself - since he is the core of the New Covenant, God and Man in perfect unity. Only by the destruction of this new Temple, in his death, will he rise again as an eternal Temple, and the eternal guarantee of the New Covenant which we enjoy.

The First Reading today gives us the Ten Commandments. Concerning 'Keep the Sabbath day holy' we hear 'in six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth and the sea and all that these hold but on the Sabbath day he rested.' The whole of creation is the work of our Creator God. What, I wonder, did our Creator God do on the eighth day, according to the spirit of the Genesis account? I think that, after his Sabbath rest, God carried on his enduring work of creation and, in Jesus, re-creation. God's task of bringing the whole of creation to its fulfilment is not ended. God has the broader vision but we can take necessary steps so that creation is not ended but fulfilled. What step can I take this Lent to live more simply and sustainably?

Let us pray for the people of the parish of St. Ambrose Barlow, Swinton, for Mgr Paul Smith their parish priest and for their primary schools and St. Ambrose Barlow High School, as well as the Franciscan Missionaries of St. Joseph. As the Lenten journey continues, may they continue to walk with the Lord who has the message of eternal life.

Pope Francis Tweet: "We would not have had the courage to believe in a God who loves humanity, if we had not known Jesus. What kind of God is prepared to die for people? What kind of God loves always and patiently, without demanding to be loved in return?"

THE HOLY FATHER'S INTENTIONS for March: Let us pray that we may experience the Sacrament of Reconciliation with renewed depth, to taste the infinite mercy of God.
