Introduction

L: Last week Jesus sent the Apostles out on their first mission, and today they return, full of the news of all achieved. they have lesus recognises their fatigue, and invites them to rest, but finds himself unable to do so, as there are "sheep without a shepherd" who need him! As we contemplate once more the astounding generosity of Jesus, let A: Amen. us praise his kindness and ask for his mercy:

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

Gospel Reading Mark 6:30-34

The apostles rejoined Jesus and told him all they had done and taught. Then he said to them, 'You must come away to some lonely place all by yourselves and rest for a while': for there were so many coming and going that the apostles had no time even to eat. So they went off in a For our Younger Friends boat to a lonely place where they could be by themselves. But people saw them going, and many could guess where; and from every town they all hurried to the place on foot and reached it before them. So as he stepped ashore he saw a large crowd; and he took pity on them because they were like sheep without a shepherd, and he set himself to teach them at some length.

The Gospel of the Lord.

You know that saying: "There's no rest for the wicked." Actually that is so untrue: the wicked are very good at making sure they have plenty of rest for themselves! Normally it is the good, the kind, the selfless and the generous who have no time to rest, because there is always some other kind thing to do, always someone else to help. This is exactly what we see in the Gospel: Jesus cannot rest while there are lost sheep wandering around! He recognises that they are missing something in life, something that only He can give, and so he sets himself to "revive their drooping spirits" by his generous teaching. This says three things to us: first, and most important, that Jesus will always watch out for us, and will always offer us himself if we are "lost". Secondly, we should try to be as generous as him: when we see people who are lost, or afraid, or hurting, it is our job (as His disciples) to do what we can - even if that means setting ourselves to work at some length! And thirdly, we should also find and create moments of rest for ourselves and each other, so that we can enjoy the "restful waters" our Good Shepherd leads us to.

Staying in bed all day, every day, is not good for us! But working hard every hour of every day is not good either! We need balance - work AND play, effort AND rest. Jesus gives his friends a bit of rest today, after they have been working so hard! Ask Jesus to help you work AND to help you rest (and make sure you do your bit to help others especially mums and dad - rest a bit too!) And enjoy your holidays when they start!

Profession of Faith
