SIXTH WEEK OF EASTER 10th—15th May 2021

THIS SHEET IS SINGLE USE ONLY. PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE IT IN CHURCH AFTER MASS

Please sanitise your hands on entering Church, and remember social distancing, remaining at least two metres away from each other person at all times. Masks or face coverings are mandatory (for all who are not exempt). There will be no singing at Mass and certain other elements are omitted or abbreviated, in order to minimise the amount of time spent inside.

Please pay attention to the guidance of stewards, especially on entering Church, and for the distribution of Holy Communion (which may happen either at the usual moment in the Mass or as you leave Church.)

Communion is given silently in the hand only, with the communicant standing, and avoiding any physical contact. Please wait in your place until invited to move forward for Holy Communion by the Stewards, always being aware of social distancing and remaining at least two metres away from the person in front of you. When you approach the priest or minister, do so with arms at "full stretch" so that there is a good distance between you. Your hands, palms upwards, one of top of the other, should be extended as flatly as possible.

THE SCRIPTURES THIS WEEK

"During the Easter Season, there is a semi-continuous reading of the Gospel of John, but with texts that have a paschal character in order to complete the reading from John during Lent. Response to the Psalm

You stretch out your hand and save me, O Lord.

Christ has risen and shone upon us whom he redeemed with his blood.

Gospel Reading

John 16:5-11: Unless I go, the Advocate will not come to you.

Communion Antiphon

The Christ had to suffer and rise from the dead, and so enter into his glory, alleluia.

WEDNESDAY

Easter Weekday or Saint Nereus and Saint Achilleus, Martyrs or Saint Pancras, Martyr

Saints Nereus and Achilleus: Roman soldiers who converted to Christianity; for this they were executed. Their tomb is in a cemetery on the Via Ardeatina in Rome, where a basilica was erected in their honour.

Saint Pancras: Pancras suffered martyrdom under Diocletian (c.304), and was buried on the Via Aurelia, again with a basilica over his tomb. Tradition tells that he was only 12 or 14 at the time of his death

Entrance Antiphon

I will praise you, Lord, among the nations; I will tell of your name to my kin, alleluia.

First Reading

Acts 17:15. 22-18:1: The God whom I proclaim is in fact the one whom you already worship without knowing it.

Response to the Psalm

Your glory fills all heaven and earth.

Gospel Acclamation

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand.

Gospel Reading

John 16:12-15: The Spirit of truth will lead you to the complete truth.

Communion Antiphon

I have chosen you from the world, says the Lord, and have appointed you to go out and bear fruit, fruit that will last, alleluia.

THURSDAY THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD

Entrance Antiphon

Men of Galilee, why gaze in wonder at the heavens? This Jesus whom you saw ascending into heaven will return as you saw him go, alleluia.

The **Gloria** is recited.

First Reading

Acts 1:1-11: Jesus was lifted up while they looked on.

Responsorial Psalm

God goes up with shouts of joy; the Lord goes up with trumpet blast.

Second Reading

Ephesians 1:17-23: He made him sit at his right hand in heaven.

Gospel Acclamation

Go, make disciples of all the nations. I am with you always; yes, to the end of time.

Gospel Reading

Matthew 28:16-20: All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.

The **Creed** is recited.

Communion Antiphon

Behold, I am with you always, even to the end of the age, alleluia.



FRIDAY Saint Matthias, Apostle

Saint Matthias: chosen by the apostles to take the place of Judas Iscariot, so that the number of apostles might remain as twelve. Tradition has it that Matthias went on to preach in Ethiopia.

Entrance Antiphon

It was not you who chose me, says the Lord, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, alleluia.

The **Gloria** is said.

First Reading

Acts 1:15-17. 20-26: The lot fell to Matthias and he was listed as one of the twelve apostles.
