#### Gospel Reading

Luke 18:1-8: God will see justice done to his chosen who cry to him.

#### Communion Antiphon

**The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives me repose, near restful waters he leads me.**

[BVM: Mary treasured all these words, reflecting on them in her heart.]

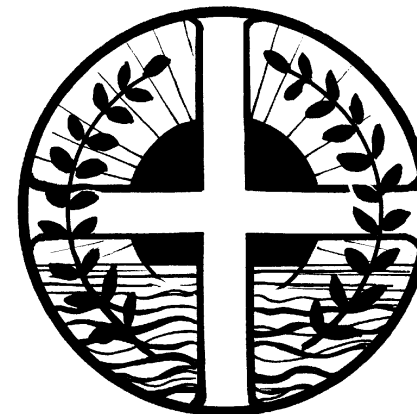

## THE SCRIPTURES THIS WEEK

This week we read a brief selection of excerpts from the book of Wisdom - a late collection of poetry; the author sings the praise of wisdom, highlighting the folly of the unwise, with a subtle reference to the idea of judgement to come. The Gospels (Luke 17-18) have a similar theme of the coming of judgement at an hour that is unknown, with the healing of the Samaritan and teaching on the need for continual prayer.

## Weekday

### Entrance Antiphon

**Let my prayer come into your presence, incline your ear to my cry for help, O Lord.**

### First Reading

Wisdom 1:1-7: Wisdom is a spirit, a friend to man. The Spirit of the Lord fills the whole world.

### Response to the Psalm

**Lead me, O Lord, in the path of life eternal.**

### Gospel Acclamation

**You will shine in the world like bright star, because you are offering it the word of life.**

### Gospel Reading

Luke 17:1-6: If your bother comes back to you seven times a day and says, 'I am sorry,' you must forgive him.

### Communion Antiphon

**The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives me repose, near restful waters he leads me.**

# TUESDAY

## The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica [FEAST]

**Dedication of the Lateran Basilica:** commemorates the dedication of the Pope Cathedral in Rome. In honour of the basilica which is called "Mother and Head of all the Churches of the City and the World", this feast is observed through all the Church as a sign of unity with the Holy See.

### Entrance Antiphon

**I saw the holy city, a new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared like a bride adorned for her husband.**

The Gloria is recited

### First Reading

Ezekiel 47:1-2.8-9.12: I saw a stream of water coming from the Temple, bringing life to all wherever it flowed.

### Responsorial Psalm

**The waters of a river give joy to God's city, the holy place where the Most High dwells.**

### Second Reading

1 Corinthians 3:9-11.16-17: You are the temple of God.

### Gospel Acclamation

**I have chosen and consecrated this house, says the Lord, for my name to be there for ever.**

### Gospel Reading

John 2:13-22: He was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body.

### Communion Antiphon

**Be built up like living stones, into a spiritual house, a holy priesthood.**

# WEDNESDAY

## Saint Leo the Great, Pope and Doctor of the Church [MEMORIAL]

**Saint Leo the Great:** he became Pope in 440, and was a true father and shepherd of his people. He strove to protect the integrity of the faith, defended the unity of the Church and repelled or alleviated the incursions of the Huns and Vandals. He died in 461.

### Entrance Antiphon

**The Lord established for him a covenant of peace, and made him the prince, that he might have the dignity of the priesthood for ever.**

### First Reading

Wisdom 6:1-11: Listen, kings, that you may learn what wisdom is.

### Response to the Psalm

**Arise, O God, judge the earth.**

### Gospel Acclamation

**Through the Good News God called us to share the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ.**

### Gospel Reading

Luke 17:11-19: No one has come back to give praise to God, except this foreigner.

### Communion Antiphon

**Peter said to Jesus: you are the Christ, the Son**

**of the living God. And Jesus replied: you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church.**

# THURSDAY

## Saint Martin of Tours, Bishop

[MEMORIAL]

**Saint Martin of Tours:** born in 316, Martin began as a soldier, but then received baptism and founded a monastery in France under the direction of Saint Hilary. He was later chosen as Bishop of Tours; here he worked hard to visit his flock, and preach against paganism. He died in 397, and was honoured as a saint - one of the first non-martyrs so to be honoured.

### Entrance Antiphon

**I shall raise up for myself a faithful priest, who will act in accord with my heart and my mind, says the Lord.**

### First Reading

Wisdom 7:22—8:1: Wisdom is a reflection of the eternal light, untarnished mirror of God's power.

### Responsorial Psalm

**Your word, O Lord, stands for ever.**

### Gospel Acclamation

**The word of the Lord remains for ever: what is this word? It is the Good News that has been brought to you.**

### Gospel Reading

Luke 17:20-25: The Kingdom of God is among you.

### Communion Antiphon

**Amen, I say to you: Whatever you did for one of the least of my brethren, you did it for me, says the Lord.**

# FRIDAY

## Saint Josaphat, Bishop and Martyr

[MEMORIAL]

**Saint Josaphat:** a saint of the Ukraine, honoured for his work for the unity of the Church; born in 1580, he became a priest and established a reputation for holiness, becoming archbishop of Polotsk. He worked
